Take a look at the restaurant reviews — more than 180 are reviewed with pertinent comments about the restaurant’s food, service and ambiance. To make a restaurant selection, check the index for type of food, specialty and area neighborhoods.

The guide has gained a strong reputation for integrity in its restaurant reviews. Diners are full of praise: “You were right on in your review.”

To be listed in the book and to be listed with a favorable critique is important to area restaurants. The Andersons visit restaurants anonymously. They do not accept advertise-

ments nor do they accept free meals or extra desserts.

As restaurateurs’ wishes to be included have continued to grow, the ability of the Andersons to visit restaurants anonymously several times during the year is a growing challenge.

Is Carolyn Anderson that person with the red curly wig? Is Jerry Anderson the one in dark glasses seated near you? For a restaurant to make the book, the authors must want to go back. Too many negatives or too much disappointing food or unpleasant service, and they are simply not included.

More than about food, the guide is a handy directory to all town resources. Information about town government, schools, libraries, museums, beaches and playgrounds, plus over 350 stores are reviewed.

If you’re wondering how to find services for seniors, how to join a country club, where to go for a fun family outing, who the best caterers are, where to swim, fish or play ball, who has the best doggie day care, how

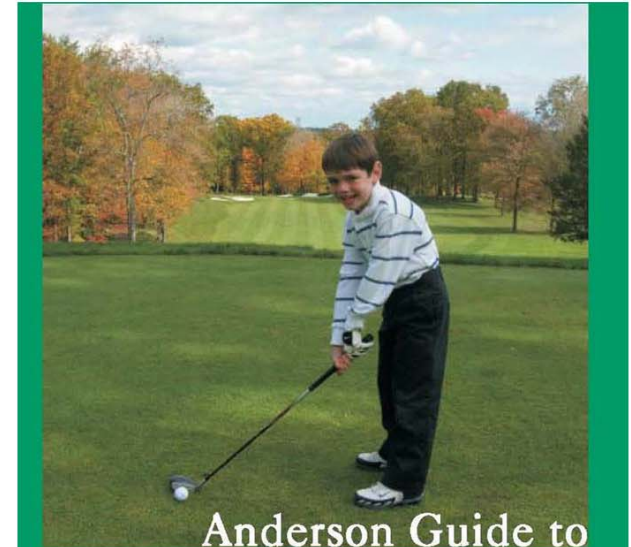
to get on a town board, or where to get the best pizza — just open the guide.

The seventh edition has an index of “Tips” written to launch residents swiftly into the status of “Greenwich Insiders.” Everyone needs to know the etiquette of crossing a Greenwich Avenue intersection when a police officer is directing traffic.

So many how-tos are included — placing an item on the Representative Town Meeting, getting VIP hospital service, obtaining a beach pass, joining a newcomers’ club and a myriad of other useful pieces of information.
